Step-by-step guide to an excellent inspection

Preparation for the inspection:

- preparing the school environment
- receiving the initial phone call
- writing a good self-evaluation report
- collating evidence, including learner and parental voice
- uploading information to the Virtual Inspection Room

What to expect during the inspection:

- the inspection timetable
- organising the work sample
- using professional dialogue
- the role of the nominee, including confidentiality
- what inspectors want to see during lesson observations
- examples of questions from inspectors, and how to answer them
- interpreting questionnaires for parents, governors, pupils and staff

After the inspection:

- addressing important aspects that require improvement
- responding to recommendations
- improving good and excellent schools
- working with local authorities and governors
- supporting your colleagues and sharing best practice
